# 2003 ARKANSAS STATE FAIR AMERICAN BOER GOAT ASSOCIATION SANCTIONED OPEN BOER GOAT SHOW

- Place: Arkansas State Fairgrounds, 2600 Howard Street, Little Rock, Arkansas 72206.
- Date: October 11th, 2003, at 1:00 PM.

- 1) ABGA rules shall govern the Open Boer Goat Show.
- 2) The show is open to all exhibitors. There is no limit on the number of animals that may be entered in a class by an exhibitor, but an exhibitor may only receive two premiums in any one class.
- 3) The entry fee for open Boer goats is \$10.00 per goat. Entry fees are to be paid to the Arkansas State Fair. Entries must be postmarked by August 25th, 2003. A late fee of \$10.00 per goat will be added to the entry fee for entries postmarked after this date.. Late entries must be received by September 9th.
- 4) Boer goats can arrive anytime after noon on Thursday October 9th. They must be in place by 6:00 PM on Friday October 10th. Boer goats will be released after the show on Saturday October 11th
- 5) All animals must be checked in with the show superintendent or an assistant.
- 6) This Show is ABGA sanctioned for Percentage Does, Full Blood/Purebred Does and Full Blood/Purebred Bucks. All Boer goats must be registered in the herdbook of a recognized association 30 days prior to the opening date of the show. Recognized associations include ABGA, International Boer Goat Association, USBGA, and the Canadian Boer Goat Association. The original registration certificate is required. Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor 30 days prior to the opening date of the show. Animals must have registration numbers at time of entry. No pending registrations will be accepted.
- 7) A registration certificate will be required for all Boer goats. The certificates must be checked by the show superintendent or an assistant before an animal can be shown.
- 8) Percentage Boer Doe Classes are for does 50% to 87% Boer. Fullblood Boer Classes are 15/16 (93.7%) and higher for does and 31/32 (96.8%) and higher for bucks.
- 9) Animals shown in group classes must also be shown in individual classes.
- 10) Substitutions are permitted within the breed. There is a \$10.00 charge for each substitution.
- 11) Base date for figuring age is the date of the show.
- 12) All goats must exhibit well-healed tattoos and be correctly tattooed. Check tattoos at time of application. Boer goats may have other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.
- 13) Exhibitors must provide their own bedding and feed. Bedding and feed can be purchased on the grounds.
- 14) Goats may be examined on grounds by fair personnel, veterinarians, or state-federal personnel. Goats showing evidence of abscesses will not be allowed to enter the barn or show and may be released by fair officials, veterinarians, or state-federal personnel. Goats showing evidence of other disease may also be released. Goats coming from out of state must have a valid certificate of veterinary inspection with identification of each animal.
- 15) Any Boer goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from all of the breeding classes. Artificial coloring will be a disqualification. Any Boer doe over 24 months of age that has not kidded and can not prove a current pregnancy will not be allowed to show.
- 16) An exhibitor shall not present an animal to be shown under a judge from whom it was purchased or possession taken within 90 days of the show.
- 17) Entry forms may be reproduced and will be accepted.
